Crown of Thorns Starfish (COTS)

- Aka Acanthaster planci
- Voracious coral predator
- Report sightings of 10 or more



They have venomous, sharp spines





























- Major driver of coral loss over the last decade
- Average coral cover has decreased from nearly 20% in 2003 to only 10% in 2011
- Likely due to climate change and COTS
